DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES ANNUAL REPORT, 2012

The Department was established in the Faculty of Arts in 1969. In its earlier years, the composition of the academic staff was predominantly expatriate, but since the 1980's, a strong and successful Kenyanization programme was implemented. The Department continued to grow steadily and was split in 1980 into two separate departments: (i) Department of Philosophy and (ii) Department of Religious Studies. In 2005, the two departments were merged with the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies of the College of Education and External Studies based at Kikuyu campus of the University of Nairobi to form a combined Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies. The combined Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies offers Certificate, Diploma, undergraduate, Masters and Doctoral (PhD) programmes in Philosophy, and Religious Studies; and a Master of Arts Degree in Human Rights. In addition, the Department offers services to the College of Education and External Studies (CEES), College of Architecture and Engineering, the School of Economics and School of Mathematics by offering Faculty of Arts approved common undergraduate degree courses in Philosophy and Religious Studies. There are three modes of learning: full- time, module II (day and evening) and distance learning.

The Department has thirty two members of staff who include Professors, Associate Professors, Senior lecturers, Lecturers, Assistant lecturers and Tutorial Fellows. The Department is headed by a Chairman. There are:

The Centre undertakes workshops, links, exchanges, attachments, and collaborative multidisciplinary research in human rights and peace.
